

Applying for Housing & Receiving Your Assignment

1. Access the Spring 2010 On-Campus Housing Application (www.reslife.uconn.edu > Bulletin Board > Housing Applications) using your NetID and password. University Information Technology Services (UITS) will issue and mail your NetID and activation code 10-14 days after your admission to UConn. The application will be available on October 12, 2009 and must be completed and submitted by **November 30, 2009**.
2. A confirmation email is sent to the student's HuskyMail account after the Spring 2010 On-Campus Housing Application is submitted.
3. Submit your **non-refundable** \$140 room deposit payment by **November 30, 2009**. Tear-off the bottom section of this guide and return to UConn with your payment. **A late application or deposit places a student on the waiting list.** Housing is not guaranteed to students on the waiting list. Payment of the room deposit by November 30th reserves housing until the official University payment deadline. Payments for all fees are due by University deadlines to retain housing. Failure to comply may result in cancellation of housing.
4. An email confirmation is sent to the student's HuskyMail account once the non-refundable room deposit payment is received.
5. If you are new to UConn, submit the Health History Form, including mandatory meningitis vaccination information, to Student Health Services prior to checking in to your housing assignment.
6. Assignments will be made on a space available basis. A housing assignment confirmation email along with check-in information will be sent via HuskyMail when your actual assignment has been made and processed.

Students Placed on the Waiting List for Housing

Students on the waiting list are not guaranteed housing. New graduate students who miss the November 30th deadline or students who have lived on campus for eight or more semesters will be placed on the waiting list should they apply for housing.

New graduate students are eligible for four semesters of graduate housing. Residents with four semesters of graduate housing can apply but will be placed on the waiting list and will not be guaranteed on-campus housing.

2009-2010 Room Rates for Graduate Students

Housing contracts in single rooms in the Graduate Residences and apartments in Northwood begin in August and end in May of the next year. Housing contracts for Hilltop Apartments begin in August and end in July of the following year. Summer apartment bridge contracts may be offered, if available. Summer housing is not available in the Graduate Residences.

Academic Year Housing Contract

Students should be aware that if they submit a housing application, they are bound to the terms and conditions of the housing contract for both semesters (fall and spring terms). This is an academic year contract and housing cannot be cancelled to reside off campus during the contract term.

Housing Assignments for Students with Disabilities or Health Concerns

Students who have documented disabilities or health concerns that may impact their living environment must complete the Spring 2010 On-Campus Housing Application and apply for a housing accommodation through the Center for Students with Disabilities (CSD). Smoke-Free Housing

All residence halls and apartments are smoke-free environments per Connecticut State Law. The Department of Residential Life will continue to collect information on individual smoking preferences to facilitate compatible roommate pairings in apartments.

Housing Options for Graduate Students

Graduate Residences

The Graduate Residences consist of three buildings in a co-educational complex that contains 439 carpeted single rooms. These buildings are subdivided into 16 residence halls with no more than eight students sharing a bathroom on a floor. The residences offer a quiet atmosphere, and are conveniently located in the center of campus. Many undergraduates are also housed in this facility. Summer housing and air conditioning are not available in this area.

In the Graduate Residences, there are four kitchens located in the corner basements (Colchester, Farmington, Lyme, Preston). Each of these kitchens has two microwaves, three regular ovens, twelve burners, two sinks, and counter space for preparation, as well as tables and chairs for dining. Each kitchen may be utilized by as many as 100 residents who are responsible for keeping these areas clean. Graduate students living in this area are encouraged to consider a limited meal plan, given the nature of community kitchens that serve many students.

Hilltop Apartments

Hilltop Apartments is an apartment community built for graduates and undergraduates. Graduate students live in a four-person fully furnished, air conditioned apartment. Each student enjoys a private bedroom and a semi-private bath. Hilltop Apartments is the most expensive area as it offers many amenities not available elsewhere on-campus.

Housing contracts for the apartments begin in August and end in July of the following year. Summer apartment bridge contracts may be offered, if available.

Graduate Apartments in Northwood Apartments (Single Applicants or Family Housing)

Northwood Apartments is an apartment community that houses graduates, undergraduates and married students with families. Summer occupancy is optional and may be available through a separate summer contract. Air conditioning is not available in this complex.

Single graduate students can live in a **fully furnished** two-bedroom apartment in designated graduate apartments. Each student enjoys a private bedroom and shares a bathroom with the other occupant.

Married graduate students with families also can apply to live in an **unfurnished** two-bedroom apartment with one bath with their family. Applicants must show verification of at least a 50% assistantship with their department at UConn with their housing application. Payments are made on a monthly basis for the family units.
